Public Works Tips

Street Light Outage:

If, at any time, you observe a street light out or not properly working, please contact Public Works with the number of the pole and location. The pole number is a yellow tag with black letters and numbers, and will be 6 to 8 feet above the ground.

Water Bills:

Remember water bills are due on the 18th of the month! If the bill is paid after the 18th, a \$20 late fee will be added. Service will be disconnected on the 25th of every month for nonpayment.

Limb Collection:

Public Works will continue picking up limbs for the summer months. Please cut limbs up into 4 foot lengths and place next to street. Please do not put them in the ditch or on the edge of pavement. If you have questions about a certain tree or situation, please call. (910-897-5183)

Grass Clippings:

Please do not place grass clippings in road side ditches. Debris in ditches cause drainage problems by clogging driveway pipes.

Leaf Collection:

Please do not add sticks or limbs in your leaf piles. Limbs will clog and damage our leaf vacuum equipment.

THE WATER DEPARTMENT WILL DISCONTINUE TAGGING DOORS FOR LATE PAYMENTS.

Due to the cost of materials and labor, the Water Department will no longer be notifying customers of cut-off of service due to non-payment. Beginning July 1, 2014, bills not paid by the 25th of each month will be subject to cut-off for non-payment.

Town Awarded A \$10,000 Community Transform Grant

The Town Board of Commissioners and the Coats Planning Board met in a joint session to discuss issues with an aging Land Use Plan. The current Land Use Plan was updated and adopted on September of 1979.

Comprehensive planning is an attempt to establish guidelines for the future growth of a community. As the term "comprehensive" suggests, this is an all-inclusive approach to addressing the issue of a community's future growth. A comprehensive plan is the formal document produced through this process. The document is official in nature, meaning that it is designed to be adopted into law by some form of local government. The document should then serve as a policy guide to decisions about community development.

A comprehensive plan should be a vision of what a community is to be in the future. The process of developing this plan should be a community-wide effort. All interest groups should play a part in delineating this vision. Specific goals and objectives should be developed along with a time frame for implementation. The contents of a comprehensive plan can vary from community to community, but in most cases, a plan should consist of the following elements: land use (both existing and future), demographics (existing and projected), housing, infrastructure, education, recreation, and thoroughfares.

Another key element in Land Use Planning is Public Health in our community. The Town applied and was awarded a \$10,000 Community Transformation Grant which will address the Public Health component.



Town Hall Holds National Day of Prayer

The Town held the 2014 National Day of Prayer in the front of Town Hall on Thursday May 1, 2014. The theme for 2014 was “**One Voice, United in Prayer**”, emphasizing the need for individuals, corporately and individually, to place their faith in the unfailing character of their Creator, who is sovereign over all governments, authorities, and men.

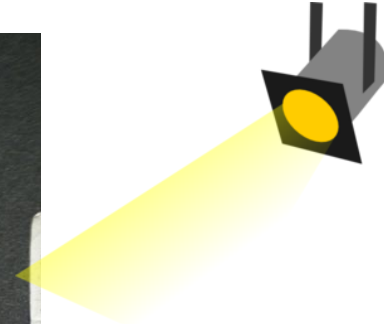
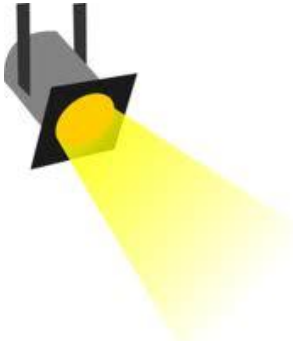

“Ordinance Highlight”

92.01- GRASS AND WEEDS:



92.01 UNCONTROLLED GROWTH OF WEEDS, TREES, PLANTS AND ACCUMULATION OF REFUSE DECLARED PUBLIC NUISANCE; COMPLAINT AND INVESTIGATION.

(A) The existence of any of the following conditions on any vacant lot or other parcel of land within the corporate limits is hereby declared to be dangerous and prejudicial to the public health or safety and to constitute a public nuisance:

- (1) The uncontrolled growth of noxious weeds or grass to a height in excess of 12 inches, causing or threatening to cause a hazard detrimental to the public health or safety;
- (2) Any accumulation of animal or vegetable matter that is offensive by virtue of odors or vapors or by the inhabitation therein of rats, mice, snakes or vermin of any kind which is or may be dangerous or prejudicial to the public health;
- (3) Any accumulation of rubbish, trash or junk causing or threatening to cause a fire hazard, or causing or threatening to cause the accumulation of stagnant water, or causing or threatening to cause the inhabitation therein of rats, mice, snakes or vermin of any kind which is or may be dangerous or prejudicial to the public health; and
- (4) Any condition detrimental to the public health which violates the rules and regulations of the County Health Department.
- (5) Any dead, diseased or damaged trees or plant materials which may harbor serious insect or pests or disease injurious to other trees or plants is considered a nuisance. Also any tree in such a state of deterioration that any part of the tree is likely to fall and damage property or cause injury to a person is considered a nuisance. Trees and plants cannot be allowed to grow in such a manner that they block public sidewalks or other types of right of way or impede pedestrian or vehicle traffic or make travel on sidewalks or roadways unsafe. Property owners will be sent notification if such tree or plant growth has been determined to be a nuisance by the Town's Authorizing Official. After 15 days if the nuisance is not abated or an acceptable agreement made between the property owner and the Town's Authorizing Official, the town may abate the nuisance and assess the costs involved to the property owner.

(B) The Police Chief, the Town's Zoning Administrator or any other designee appointed by the Board of Commissioners (hereinafter sometimes called the Town's Authorizing Official), upon notice from any person of the existence of any of the conditions described in division (A) of this section, shall cause to be made by the appropriate County Health Department official, or town official, an investigation as may be necessary to determine whether, in fact, such conditions exist as to constitute a public nuisance as declared in division (A) of this section.

§ 92.02 NOTICE TO ABATE NUISANCE.

Upon a determination that such conditions constituting a public nuisance exist, the town's Authorizing Official shall notify, in writing, by hand delivery or by mailing certified return receipt requested, through the United States Postal Service, the owner, occupant or person in possession of the premises in question of the conditions constituting the public nuisance and shall order the prompt abatement thereof within seven days from the receipt of the written notice.
