

Bulky items include all large trash items that cannot fit in your cart, such as furniture, white goods (appliances), large toys such as bicycles and swing sets, lawn equipment and used tires are collected by the Town. Bulky items may not be placed at the street for more than 48 hours prior to your scheduled collection day. The Town does not collect building materials resulting from construction, demolition, remodeling or repair work.

### **ACCEPTABLE ITEMS**

- Clean Metal: Bicycles, etc. All clean metal must be separated from other bulk items.
- Paint cans: Paint cans should be opened and the paint allowed to dry. With the lid removed and contents completely dry, paint cans may be placed curbside.
- Furniture & Large Items: Chairs, table, couches, mattress & box springs, lawn furniture, grills (no propane tanks), microwave ovens, push lawnmowers (gas and oil must be removed), large children's toys, etc.
- White Goods: Stoves, refrigerators, freezers, water heaters. (contents and door/lids must be removed on all items)
- Tires: (limit 4 per residence)

### NON-ACCEPTABLE ITEMS

- Building/Remodeling Items: including but not limited to carpet, rocks, dirt, and concrete
- Batteries: large sized alkaline batteries and wet cell / lead acid batteries such as the kind found in cars, trucks, and boats
- Hazardous Materials: of any type
- Vehicle Parts: of any type

**DO NOT:** PLACE DEBRIS IN DRAINAGE DITCHES OR ROADWAY.

COLLECTION: First and Third Mondays of each month

# curbside Recycling

The Town contracts with Waste Industries to collect the recyclables. You are provided a 65 gallon rollout container in which to place your recycles. Recycling reduces the amount of landfill space needed, so **PLEASE RECYCLE!** 

### ACCEPTABLE ITEMS



- Newspaper
- White Paper
- Glass: Green, brown and clear
- Corrugated cardboard
- Paperboard: cereal boxes, shoe boxes
- Brown paper bags
- Plastic bottles with a neck: #1 through #5
- Aseptic juice boxes
- Gable-top paper cartons: such as milk cartons
- Metal food cans
- Steel cans and Empty aerosol cans
- Aluminum beverage cans
- · Aluminum foil: with no food residue
- Six-pack rings
- Magazines
- Junk mail and catalogs

### **NON-ACCEPTABLE ITEMS**

- Frozen food trays
- Metal Lids: from food containers and beverages
- Plastic wrap
- Plastic bags
- Styrofoam
- Stamps and stickers in junk mail
- Motor oil containers
- Chemicals such as Liquid Plumber or Round Up

# Household Trash

The Town contracts with Waste Management to collect household trash. You are provided a 95 gallon rollout container in which to place your trash.

### ACCEPTABLE ITEMS

### NON-ACCEPTABLE ITEMS

- Dirt, rocks, sod, concrete, hot ashes
- Large Appliances or furniture
- Flammable materials: such as paint, gas, oil
- Animal Carcasses
- Yard Waste
- Construction Debris: from remodeling or demolition
- Toxic Waste
- Corrugated Cardboard
- Aluminum Cans
- Electronic Equipment: Televisions, computers
- Motor oil and filters
- Building Materials
- Wet cell Batteries
- Liquid Waste
- White Goods

# **Yard Waste**

Curbside collection of yard waste is provided by the Town. The Town cannot collect debris cut by a private contractor.



### **ACCEPTABLE ITEMS**

- Limbs cut to 5 foot lengths and up to 9 inches in Diameter.
- Grass clippings
- Small piles of leaves

COLLECTION: Weekly

# Fall Leaf Collection

### The Town Collects leaves on a seasonal basis.

- Do not put leaves in plastic bags
- Do not put limbs in the leaf piles
- Keep piles away from and out of drainage ditches

COLLECTION: November through February

# **Electronic Recycling**

The Town contracts with American Greenz Inc. for any e-waste recycling. **Beginning July 1, 2011**Computers and TVs will no longer be accepted in N.C. Landfills.

# **Container Tips**

Follow these simple guidelines when using your trash or recycling container:



- All items must be placed in the containers.
- Containers must be place adjacent to the street the night before the scheduled collection day and removed the day of collection.
- Allow 3-5 feet of clearance between your containers
- Place containers with lid opening toward the street.
- Always place household trash in plastic bags.
- Occasionally rinse your container to control insects.
